Under the leadership of the UAE Prime Minister's Office, HAMA aims to empower Emirati female military recruits with the skills needed for a successful career at the conclusion of their service. Participants develop the digital, creative, occupational, and personal skills necessary for employment in a variety of fields, including design, project management, and entrepreneurship.

The Foundation signed an MoU with the Prime Minister's Office at the Ministry of Cabinet Affairs to support HAMA by equipping military recruits with in-demand transferable skills to enhance their future readiness. The Foundation did this by providing capacity building in the form of interactive workshops to nominated trainers who will support workshop delivery and ensure scalability. The workshops leverage Young Thinkers Program courses to equip recruits with important skills including Emotional Intelligence, Public Speaking, Presentation Skills, Strategic Thinking and Problem Solving.
